God is doing something new! God is coming into the world. God is entering your life." Advent is a bugle playing reveille. "God is near. Wake up!"





# Choral Cantata At our Sunday morning

worship service on December 11, the Westminster Church Choir will perform the cantata, Jesus, Joy and Pleasure, by the great north German baroque composer Dietrich Buxtehude. Though largely remembered today as an organ composer, Buxtehude also wrote a considerable number of works for instrumental ensembles and choirs; many of these were composed for the annual series of sacred concerts (Abendmusiken) which were presented each Sunday evening in Advent at the Marienkirche in Lübeck, where Buxtehude was organist. These famous concerts drew audiences from all over Germany: even J.S.Bach, as a young man, once made the 200-mile trek to Lübeck on foot to meet Buxtehude and hear the music.

Jesus, Joy and Pleasure is in seven brief movements, and is based on the well-known chorale JESU, MEINE FREUDE. It is scored for chorus, soloists, strings, and keyboard, and bears a strong resemblance to Bach's own later cantata of the same name, suggesting that Bach himself knew the work well.

At the December 11 service, our choir will be joined by violinists Ann-Marie Barker Schwartz and Kathryn Norman, and cellist Garfield Moore. Soloists will include Kelly Bird, Martha Reisner, and Allan Kirk. Al Fedak will be at the harpsichord, and Sue Fedak will conduct. The work will be sung in English. This is music of great faith and beauty; we look forward to sharing it with our entire church family •




