Reflections

PASTORAL CHURCH MEMBERSHIP continued

By Pastor James Reisner



I began the essay, "I am thinking that maybe Westminster should do away with church membership. Now that I have your attention..." I then went on to reflect on the preferences of Generation X and Millennials for whom the concept of membership is not appealing. This is a challenge for the church currently and in the years ahead and is worth pondering. What I failed to do was to communicate that for folks like me (Baby Boomers and the Greatest Generation) church membership works just fine, and has throughout our years of involvement in the church.

Let me assure everyone that we are *not* about to do away with church membership. We are not about to drop life-long members from our roles. People who have given untold hours of selfless service and have dedicated significant financial resources to the ministry and mission of Westminster Presbyterian Church through the years will not be put out the door. I am concerned that some of you may have interpreted my words as unappreciative or dismissive of the contributions of time and talent that church members have made. That certainly was *not* my intent! But as one of my homiletics professors once said, "You are responsible for not only what you say, but also for how you are heard."

We have what I hope can be a teachable moment. People are asking some very good questions. As the session discussed this in its October meeting, one elder asked, "What kind of commitment are we asking people to make as they become members, or as they become part of our community?" Another voice wondered whether by accommodating an uncertain commitment, we might water down and devalue the whole concept of membership for everyone. An e-mail gave an historic perspective that differences in succeeding generations' sensibilities have been evident in the church for centuries and we are merely entering a new phase of an age old debate.

Thank you for reading last month's newsletter. Thank you for reading this. Thank you to those who have taken me up on my request that you speak to an elder or write a letter to session. We have an important conversation underway.

I invite you to come to the Sunday, November 24th, 2nd hour, "Church Community and Commitment," when we will continue the discussion • --Pastor Reisner

BURNT HILLS ORATORIO SOCIETY CONCERT




HYMNAL DEDICATION SET FOR NOVEMBER 3

MISSION BUDGET

When the 2014 budget was presented to the congregation in October, there was a request for further information about the Mission budget. We are supplying here the actual budget allocations for 2012. These numbers closely approximate financial commitments for 2013 and 2014. Some local discretionary mission funds are held back until late in the year in order to address emergency needs that often occur in December, so we cannot yet supply actual numbers for 2013.



Each year Congregation Beth Emeth, Trinity United Methodist Church, Westminster Presbyterian Church and the First Unitarian Universalist Society of Albany gather for a joint Thanksgiving service. Trinity, Westminster and FUSA (only one U in those days) all had fires that burned our buildings at different times at the beginning of the 20th century. While they were being repaired, we all worshiped at Congregation Beth Emeth's building. When our buildings were rebuilt, we began the tradition of having this joint service.

One custom we have for this service is to bring non-perishable canned and dry goods that can be used by FOCUS Food Pantry as our joint Thanksgiving offertory. Donations to the pantry will also be accepted •

The FOCUS breakfast program will shift from Breakfast Express to the Breakfast Club on Tuesday, November 6th, Election Day. Hearty, full breakfasts will be served on Tuesdays, Wednesday, and Thursdays in our Assembly Room. We often have over 100 hungry guests during the winter months. For the past eleven years Westminster has been staffing and providing meals on Sunday nights at the Emergency Overflow Shelter housed at First Lutheran Church in Albany. 


