# Reflections

## PASTORAL CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

I am thinking that maybe Westminster should do away with church membership. Now that I have your attention, let me explain:

When I converse with people who are visiting Westminster and mention church membership, I can see their eyes glaze over, and their enthusiastic smiles freeze in place. Membership may be an idea whose time has passed. Generation Y folks are interested in Christianity. They are interested in community. They are not all that interested in institutional religion. They want to find a place where they belong (as in a place where they fit in and that feels right for them), but they don't want to belong to ... an organization, an institution, an association, a church. The issue is authenticity. Does it feel real? Formalizing relationships by way of membership diminishes their experience of authenticity.

Perhaps our focus and language needs to shift from membership to participation. What if people who come to worship regularly are regarded as part of Westminster, whether they have "joined" the church or not? What if everyone who makes a financial pledge to the church is regarded as the same? If you teach in the church school, or attend the Kerygma Bible study, or attend youth group, you are one of us. What if every year we observed a recommitment ceremony that affirmed the dedication and support of people within the Westminster community. Certainly, it's not hard to think of glitches and complications if we

made such a transition. How do we recognize new people? What do we call ourselves if we are no longer "members"? The upside may be worth the administrative headaches. The living breathing church must always be about the work of risking the new, and putting aside that which has become overly formal and stale.

In the months ahead, the Session will be thinking afresh about church membership and how best to support and recognize the good people who make contributions of all kinds to Westminster Presbyterian Church. I encourage you to share your thoughts on this with Session members, and with Pastor Frances and me.

One last thought: The Gospels never mention Jesus and the twelve members.




#### INTERNATIONAL PEACEMAKER FROM NIGER TO VISIT WESTMINSTER OCTOBER 12TH-15TH

Rev. Sani Nomaou is President of the Evangelical Church in the Republic of Niger, the largest Christian denomination consisting of 16,000 members. Only about 1% of the country's population is Christian in a majority Muslim country.

Rev. Nomaou uses radio to reach out to people in his vast, rural, and largely agrarian country. As president of the country's largest Christian denomination, he is often a voice in the national dialogue between Christians and Muslims.

He will be accompanied in the U.S. by Rev. Josh Heikkila, mission co-worker in Ghana who has hosted our 2011 and 2013 mission teams.


